Abraham (Part 10)

"And the Spirit of the LORD shall rest upon him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of the LORD. And his delight shall be in the fear of the LORD. He shall not judge by what his eyes see, or decide disputes by what his ears hear," (Isaiah 11:2-3)

Looking at People through God's Eyes

<u>Genesis 17:15-17</u> – (15) "And God said to Abraham, '<u>As for Sarai your wife, you</u> <u>shall not call her name Sarai, but Sarah shall be her name</u>. (16) I will bless her, and moreover, I will give you a son by her. I will bless her, and she shall become nations; kings of peoples shall come from her.' (17) Then Abraham fell on his face and laughed and said to himself, 'Shall a child be born to a man who is a hundred years old? Shall Sarah, who is ninety years old, bear a child?'"

(20) As for Ishmael, I have heard you; behold, I have blessed him and will make him fruitful and multiply him greatly. He shall father twelve princes, and I will make him into a great nation. (21) But I will establish my covenant with Isaac, whom Sarah shall bear to you at this time next year.' (22) When he had finished talking with him, God went up from Abraham." "And Elisha sent a messenger to him, saying, 'Go and wash in the Jordan seven times, and your flesh shall be restored, and you shall be clean.' But Naaman was angry and went away, saying, '<u>Behold, I</u> <u>thought that he would surely come out to me and stand and call upon</u> <u>the name of the LORD his God, and wave his hand over the place and</u> <u>cure the leper</u>. Are not Abana and Pharpar, the rivers of Damascus, better than all the waters of Israel? Could I not wash in them and be clean?' <u>So he turned and went away in a rage</u>." (2 Kings 5:10-12)
