<u>James 1:2–3</u> 2 Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds, 3 for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness.

Romans 5:3-4 3 Not only that, but we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, 4 and endurance produces character, and character produces hope

(1) History/Science

<u>Genesis 9: 7,18-19</u> 7 And as for you, be fruitful and multiply; Bring forth abundantly in the earth And multiply in it." **18** Now the sons of Noah who went out of the ark were Shem, Ham, and Japheth. And Ham *was* the father of Canaan. **19** These three *were* the sons of Noah, and from these the whole earth was populated. (NKJV)

<u>Ecclesiastes 3:11</u> He has made everything beautiful in its time. <u>He has also set eternity in the human heart;</u> yet no one can fathom what God has done from beginning to end. (NIV)

<u>Romans 1:20</u> For since the creation of the world God's invisible qualities—his eternal power and divine nature—have been clearly seen, being understood from what has been made, <u>so that people are without excuse.</u> (NIV)
